Palliative Care Case Study



What are the challenges presented in this case?

- How can nursing help meet those challenges?
- Respect for patient and family wishes

Problems



- Communication between health care workers
- Unrealistic expectation from family
- Lack of experience and support
- Environment: room design not for end of life care

Moral distress:

- how to stop futile medical care
- What to say? When to say? How far should I tell them? How much they would like to know?

Advantages



- ICU nurse patient ratio
- Lower risk patient die alone
- Good symptoms management: pain, anxiety, and respiratory distress

Offers family meeting during bereavement time.
